#### **NAPLAN**

NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents and carers to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress. NAPLAN online is a tailored test that adapts to student responses, providing better assessment and more precise results. During Weeks 3 and 4, students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in NAPLAN online for writing, reading, language conventions and numeracy.

Please make sure that the SkoolBag app is downloaded on your phone or device. Communication is also available on the school website and Facebook page and all communication is sent home in paper form. Skoolbag notifications mean that families do not miss out on important events and information.

### **Parking**

Please take note of NSW Parking Rules, attached below.

It has been brought to our attention that visitors to our school are parking across resident's driveways. We acknowledge that finding a park can be difficult; however, we please ask our visitors to respect our neighbours and refrain from parking across driveways.

#### No Parking

#### You must not stop or park your vehicle:

- alongside another parked vehicle (double park)
- across a driveway, unless you're picking up or dropping off passengers
- on a median strip, unless a sign says you can
- on a traffic island
- within an intersection
- on a children's crossing or pedestrian crossing
- on footpaths and nature strips, unless a sign says you can
- in a slip lane, unless a sign says you can.
- Your parked vehicle must not block the flow of traffic or become a danger to other road users.

In some places, you must not park at certain times or under certain conditions.

If you have a Mobility Parking Scheme (MPS) permit, you can stop for up to 5 minutes.

### **Athletics Carnival**

Unfortunately, we have needed to make changes to the date and location of our athletics carnival.

# Our carnival will now be held on Friday 1 July at Wangi.

The reason for this change is a resurfacing issue at Hunter Sports Centre, Glendale. The centre commenced a track resurface January 2022 with a completion date of March. Unfortunately, the project has been significantly delayed due to the ongoing inclement weather. LMMC and Contractor Polytan had an on-site meeting to discuss works required and project completion date. The general consensus from this meeting is that the track works will not be completed until mid to late June.

Given this information, it is with regret that Hunter Sports Centre is unable to host our Athletics Carnival on 16 May 2022. There were no alternate days for us to book prior to zone. This will have affected many schools.

A new permission note will be distributed in the coming weeks.

## COVID - Smart Settings in Term 2

Many of our existing COVID-smart measures continue into Term 2, including:

- $\cdot$  rapid antigen testing for symptomatic students and staff
- · vaccinations including booster shots (from 3 months after your child's primary COVID-19 dose) are encouraged for all eligible students and their families.
- ventilation
- · good hygiene practices
- · enhanced cleaning

#### What's new in Term 2

- · Change to close contact isolation requirements The NSW Premier has announced changes to requirements for close contacts which means that from Week 1 of Term 2, students and staff who are identified as close contacts will be able to attend school with certain risk mitigations in place.
- Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) The department will continue to supply RATs to students and staff in Term 2 to support symptomatic testing and testing of close contacts returning to school.
- · Masks A new recommendation from NSW Health is for people who have recently recovered from COVID-19 to wear a mask for an additional 3 days following their 7-day isolation period (from days 8 to 10).
- · Responding to local COVID-19 conditions —At times, the reintroduction of stricter guidelines may be necessary depending on local conditions.
- . **Ventilation** We're maximising natural ventilation in classrooms and learning spaces while balancing thermal comfort during the cooler months.
- Reducing the risk of illness this winter Please follow general advice from NSW Health to protect our school community as we head into winter.
